



Imagine spending your day working in a state of the art facility, testing jet engines that propel passengers across the sky at hundreds of miles an hour, and then spending your lunch break outside watching deer graze in a nearby field. This is a typical day for a Peebles Test Operation (PTO) employee.

PTO is proud to be a part of the GE tradition of "imagination at work". We are 270+ employees strong in craftsmanship, work ethics, and ingenuity surrounded by some of the most beautiful scenery southern Ohio has to offer. PTO is part of what Forbes magazine called "The Most Admired Company in the World", yet enjoys the intimacy of a small business where we know

everyone's name at the Christmas party.

Being one of the world's premiere sites for jet engine testing, we are a small city with the infra-structure to accurately measure thrust from our smallest engines producing 2000 lbs. of thrust to the world record holder the GE90 at 127,900 lbs. of thrust. PTO also conducts acoustic, fuel efficiency, and emissions tests, to better protect the air quality and environment. Our test sites are considered the "gold standard" for all other GE jet engine test facilities. The accuracy of any GE engine test anywhere in the world is measured against this facility, right here in Peebles, Ohio.

Beyond the physical campus our employees travel the globe and help many of our partners and customers with their testing needs.

Growing With Jet Technology

PTO was originally acquired for rocket testing in 1955. In the 1960's the focus changed to high-bypass turbo fan engine testing. Because of our remote location PTO played a key role in the development of these engines. This technological marvel was powerful enough to carry enormous Army transport planes anywhere on the planet—and later helped revolutionize commercial aviation as well.

Since then, the PTO Team has been involved in the development and certification phase testing that are on the cutting edge of aviation. The production phase involves assurance testing of new engines to guarantee they meet strict requirements before shipment to GE customers. And finally, field return testing is performed to validate maintenance and upgrades to engines already in service.

Technology Meets Nature

Because of the terrain, abundant water, plus our weapons ban and restrictions on entry, PTO has developed into the largest privately owned natural area in the state totaling over 7,000 acres. This environment allows for a number of wildlife species to flourish. This is evident in recent years when biologists visiting the site have identified over 500 species of plants, 37 species of reptiles, 25 species of mammals, and over 100 species of birds, many of which are state listed as rare or endangered.

GE PTO takes great pride in ensuring the protection of our pristine environment as the facility continues to thrive. In addition to the forested land GE-PTO maintains four acres of man-made wetlands, several acres of natural wetlands and two streams. One stream running through the facility is considered one of the most pristine habitats in the state.

The local schools, universities and scientists often come to this area to study the wildlife in this unspoiled habitat.

Ecomagination At Work

The Peebles facility has very specific goals regarding future Green House Gas (GHG) emissions reductions, which follow a closely monitored set of metrics. In GE's recent ecomagination report, the company made a public commitment to maintain emissions at 2004 levels and reduce them further by one percent by 2012. GE holds all of its businesses to this company-wide goal, including the Aviation business – the organizational home of the Peebles facility.

Today's engines are ever more fuel efficient, carrying passengers and cargo to the far corners of the globe with less fuel burn than ever before. PTO continues to play a strong role in the certification and acceptance testing of these engines.

Mineral Springs Lake Farm Resort

ircle on your map a little gem called Mineral Springs Lake. It's more than 100 acres of fishing, water sports, family recreation and camping that you don't want to miss.

Mineral Springs, as the name suggested, is fed by over a dozen underground springs. A beautiful lake that is complemented by a backdrop of mountains that bloom with redbuds and dogwoods come spring. The shoreline is a mix of bays, points and timbered coves that fishermen find ideal for wetting a line.

When Mineral Springs Lake Farm Resort owner Billy Smalley impounded these hollows in the early 1970s, he left pockets of standing timber, which greatly improved the aquatic habitat, and subsequent fish population that followed. Over the years, the lake has been stocked with largemouth, smallmouth, perch, rock bass, bluegill and catfish. Harmless freshwater jellyfish, about the size of a penny, inhabit the lake too and can readily be observed during the summer in the lake's clear water.

At 103 acres, it is the largest body of water in Adams County. The lake averages 27 feet deep with a maximum depth approaching 60 feet. Though water clarity varies with the seasons, visibility is nearly 60 feet in August. To preserve the unique purity and clarity of the lake only electric motors are permitted.

The camping here is as relaxing as rocking on grandma's frontporch swing. Peacefulness and quiet inhabit the campground for a refreshing stay. Mineral Springs can boast more than 300-plus campsites with full hookups, and most have a view of the water. The camp store is stocked with everything campers will need for a weekend or a monthlong stay.

Hiking, picnicking, a shelter house, showers and ATV trails are on the 500 acres that surround the lake. For hunters, only 20 minutes away is Brush Creek State Forest, Shawnee State Forest and Tranquility Wildlife area. For nature lovers, nearby Davis Memorial State Nature Preserve and Shoemaker Preserve offer wilderness hiking and spring wildflowers, and if you're a history buff, explore the remote settlement of Mineral Springs.

Whether you're a fisherperson, hiker or hunter, or are looking for a seasonal getaway, check out Mineral Springs Lake Farm Resort at www. mineralspringslakefarmresort.com.

dams County is largely a rural community, its slower pace plainly evident. Absent are amusement parks, crowded beaches and shopping malls. What visitors will find are tranquil places, scenic views, country roads, history, an Amish community and nature in abundance.

Below is just a sampling of some of the special places that define Adams County.

Edge of Appalachia Preserve: A private preserve of more than 14,000 acres of forest, prairies, waterfalls, gorges and mountains, containing more than 100 rare species of plants and animals. Administered jointly by the Nature Conservancy and Cincinnati Museum Center, the preserve contains and protects such local landmarks as Buzzardroost Rock, Cedar Falls, Red Rock, The Swirl Hole and Lynx Prairie.

State Nature Preserves: Because of Adams County's unique geography and plant communities, the Ohio Division of Natural Areas & Preserves has designated six state nature preserves within the county, each distinctively different. Most have trails with signs pointing out the unique plant life and features that make each preserve special.

Adams Lake: The only state park in Adams County, Adams Lake is 47 acres and can boast early spring trout fishing and good bass fishing. The park has a playground, restrooms, a three-quartermile blacktop walking path, boat ramp, picnic areas and a large shelter house.

Adams Lake is a popular spot for local outdoor activities.

Shawnee State Forest: Shawnee State Forest is Ohio's largest state forest at more than 63,000 acres. It can also lay claim to having the state's only designated Wilderness Area. Shawnee is some of the most mountainous, forested and remote country in Ohio. Also known as the Little Smokies, spring wildflowers and fall foliage draw visitors from all over the state.

The Wheat Ridge Amish Community: The Amish community in Adams County has grown from its humble roots in 1976 to a community of more than 96 households. Visitors will find a variety of shops, bakeries, furniture stores, goods and services. Amish buggies and horses, children on scooters, babies being pulled in wagons, and clothes drying in the fresh air, are some of the sights visitors will observe while in Wheat Ridge.

Original Quilt Barn Trail: Adams County started the original quilt barn trail in 2001 with 21 quilt squares that formed a "Clothesline of Quilts" driving tour throughout the county. The idea has caught on as presently there are now more than 40 quilt squares on barns throughout Adams County, and that original idea has spread across the U.S. and Canada.

Serpent Mound: As one of the greatest Native American earthworks, Serpent Mound is known around the world. Designed within the mound are summer and winter solstice alignments. Many mysteries and unanswered questions remain about the mound's origin and builders.

The Ohio River Scenic Byway: The stretch of U.S. 52 through southern Adams County along the Ohio River is among the most scenic routes in Ohio. This rural highway winds past mountains and small communities with little or no industry along its way. No wonder it was designated a State Scenic Byway.

Ohio Brush Creek: Simply one of the most beautiful and scenic streams in southern Ohio, Brush Creek is a shining example of a high quality stream. As inviting to float in as it is to fish in. There are six public access points along the stream. Floating or fishing, Ohio Brush Creek is a great way to spend a summer day.

Harshaville & Kirker Covered Bridges: Of Adams County covered bridges, only two remain. Harshaville is still in use and is located on Graces Run Road. Kirker Covered Bridge, no longer in use, is located on State Route 136.



The Birthplace of the American Quilt Trail









The American Quilt Trail encompasses more than 120 communities across 30 states and Canada. Adams County has more than 40 quilt barns.

here are so many "must see" attractions within the richness that is Adams County. But certainly no visit would be complete without a drive along the quilt trail known as the Adams County Quilt Sampler. Scattered through the scenic countryside are barns adorned with painted quilts — some applied directly to the barn surface, others painted on wood and mounted. Some patterns are simple blocks of color, much like cloth quilts that are made of plain scraps. Others are bold and brilliantly designed — a feast for the eyes.

These painted quilt barns, or barn




quilts as they are sometimes known, are more than just attractive additions to the byways of Adams County. They are part of the American Quilt Trail, a network of more than 120 such quilt museums that can be found in 30 states and in Canada. Barn quilts comprise the single largest public arts movement in our nation's history. And it all began in Adams County.

Stop to see the Snail's Trail pattern at the farm where the quilt trail model originated. Here, Donna Sue Groves was inspired to honor her mother, Maxine, an accomplished quilter, by having a painted quilt added to the barn near the front of their property. Imagine the small, gray barn, unadorned, having served its useful life, only to be reborn as the home of a beautiful quilt square.

Donna Sue Groves conceived the quilt trail concept, but rather than beginning with her own barn, she worked with the community to create the 20-block sampler that has now expanded to 40 or so quilt barns in Adams County. Just

a bit up the road from the Groves farm, you will easily find the spot where the first barn quilt was unveiled in 2001—appropriately enough, an Ohio Star pattern. The quilt squares are indeed stars among the many sights within Adams County, and their place in our nation's cultural history is truly remarkable.



More than 2,200 Adams County residents fought in the Civil War, a large portion in the 70th Ohio Volunteer Infantry.

dams County played a significant role in the Civil War having sent more than 2,200 of its men and boys to the battlefields during the 1860s. Adams County sent more men per capita than any other Ohio county. From a population of 20,060 in 1860, more than 10 percent of the population volunteered to fight. A large part of those volunteers made up the 70th Ohio Volunteer Infantry. Seven companies in the 70th were made up entirely of men from Adams County.

Young and old, Adams County men fought in the battle of Shiloh, Perryville, Stones River, Chickamauga, Chattanooga and Vicksburg and served in General Sherman's armies during his march through Atlanta.

Adams County had men in 12 different Ohio Volunteer Infantries, the 7th Ohio Calvary, Battery F of the First Ohio Light Artillery, the 1st and 2nd Regiment of Heavy Artillery and the 2nd Independent Battery Ohio Light Artillery. In 1862, Adams County sent a company of "Squirrel Hunters" to Cincinnati to protect it from Confederate attack.

There are 1,354 known Civil War veterans buried in Adams County of which six are Confederate soldiers. Of the 283 cemeteries in Adams County, 115 contain soldiers of the Civil War. In Manchester cemetery, 238 Civil War veterans lie at rest. In Winchester, 88 Civil War veterans are buried. Sandy Springs cemetery contains 74 veterans, and at Tranquility cemetery, 65 Civil War veterans have been laid to rest. At West Union Cemetery, John L. Baldridge, the last surviving Civil War veteran in Adams County, is buried. Baldridge served with the 129th OVI.

Adams County did not escape the war. In July 1863, General John H. Morgan swept through Adams County in what is known as Morgan's Raid with 3,000 Confederate cavalrymen passing through Winchester, where they occupied homes, ransacked businesses and seized horses and firearms. During the turmoil of the raid, a captured Union officer named Hines

managed to escape by hiding under the floorboards of a local residence. Another 500 cavalrymen, under the command of Colonel Dick Morgan, came up through **Eckmansville**, where they killed a man. The next morning, Union cavalrymen under General Hobson were fed and shown great hospitably as they pursued Morgan's raiders.

After Morgan left Winchester, his raiders followed **Graces Run Road** across the **Harshaville Covered Bridge**, which Morgan did not burn and is still in use today. They then followed **Wheat Ridge** to the small village of **Dunkinsville**, where they inflicted considerable damage. From Dunkinsville, Morgan's Raiders turned north through **Jack Town** and to **Locust Grove**, stopping first at **Wickerham Inn** on the evening of July 15, 1863, where the Confederate soldiers







spent the night before continuing their rampage through southern Ohio.


At the old Adams County Fairgrounds in West Union, Camp Hamer, a Civil War training camp was established. In 1861, the 70th OVI was organized and trained at the fairgrounds. The old, stone courthouse in West Union was converted into a hospital to serve the camp. Those who trained at that camp saw battle at Shiloh, Vicksburg and Atlanta and served under General Sherman.

At the home of John T. Wilson, the seeds were sown for the formation of Company E of the Ohio 70th Ohio Volunteer Infantry. Wilson, an outspoken abolitionist, was part of the Underground Railroad in Adams County, using his stately mansion in **Tranquility** to usher slaves toward freedom. Wilson, at age 50, gathered the initial 62 men of Company E and joined with company A, B, C, F, G and H as part of the 70th OVI under the command of Colonel Joseph Cockerill. In 1862, on April 6 and 7, Wilson led the men of Company E into battle at Shiloh.

Wilson was wealthy by the standards of the day and donated a considerable sum of his fortune over to worthy causes. In his later years, Wilson financed the building of the Wilson Children's Home in West Union. In his will, Wilson left money for the construction of a monument to the men of Adams County who paid the ultimate sacrifice during the Civil War, having lost his only son to the war. The monument was dedicated to the people of Adams County during a ceremony on June 10, 1893 in which Col. John Cockerill, the son of the late Col. Joseph Cockerill, organizer of the 70th OVI, unveiled the tall monument in

front of the Wilson Children's Home. The inscription upon the monument reads "In Memory of the Soldiers of Adams County Ohio who were Killed or Died during the War of the Late Rebellion."

The historic John T. Wilson home in Tranquility is currently undergoing historical renovation by Ralph and Patricia Alexander and is host to Adams County Civil War Day, to be held October 20. The home, known as "Prominence," is a nationally registered and historic landmark.





whitetails. Adams County is renowned
for its quality deer hunting, attracting
hunters from all over the nation to the
rural farm county that is home to some of
the world's biggest whitetails.

Here is a list of public fishing and hunting opportunities and areas in Adams County:

Fishing

The **Ohio River** in Adams County offers good fishing for all river species. Fishing for hybrid stripers, white bass, black bass and catfish is good throughout the summer. Public boat ramps are located at Manchester, Brush Creek and Rome.

Ohio Brush Creek has an excellent spring white-bass run in late April. Smallmouth fishing is good on Brush Creek from late April through July.




Anglers will also find good numbers of channel and flathead catfish, rock bass, bluegill and sunfish. Brush Creek has five public canoe launches: Serpent Mound, Jacksonville, Twin Bridges, Waggoner Riffle and Beasley Fork Bridge.

Adams Lake is a 47-acre lake and one of the first lakes in Ohio to be stocked with trout each spring. Adams Lake also has catfish, bluegills and good-sized largemouth bass. A boat ramp is located across from park headquarters and is limited to electric motors only.

Winchester Lake is approximately a 30-acre body of water just west of Winchester on Tri-County Road. It contains crappie, bass, bluegill and catfish. A ramp is available for small boat launching. The lake is limited to electric motors only.

The **Tranquility Wildlife Area** anglers will find fishing at several of the dozen ponds located there. The Ohio Division of Wildlife keeps most of Tranquility's ponds stocked with largemouth bass, channel catfish and bluegill.



Hunting

he Tranquility Wildlife Area offers more than 4,250 acres of public hunting. Open weedy fields and crops add a diverse variety of habitats that has created fertile ground for both deer and turkey.

Shawnee State Forest is Ohio's largest state forest at 63,250 acres. It is mountainous and heavily wooded with oaks, hickories, pine, maple, poplar and ash. It offers good hunting for deer, turkey, squirrel and grouse. Other places of interest would be the 8,000-acre Shawnee Wilderness Area and the adjoining 8,000-acre Back Country Management Area. The combined 16,000 acres form the largest block of back-country hunting in Ohio.

Brush Creek State Forest in northeastern Adams County is more than 12,000 acres. The forest is scattered into several tracts comprised of oaks, hickory, maple, ash and pine.

The **Edge of Appalachia Preserve** allows public hunting on 2,300 acres of preserve property by permit only. Permits are free and valid for both the archery and deer gun season. For more information, call (937) 544-2880.





Adams County's Five Best Hikes

all, winter, spring or summer, the hiking trails are open year round with each visit as different as the seasons. The following trails are the five most popular hikes in Adams County. Three of the hikes are on the 14,000-acre Edge of Appalachia Preserve. The Davis and Whipple hikes are located on state nature preserves. Most hikes are easy to moderate with views so spectacular that you'll want to have a camera, because what you see you'll want to take home and keep.

1. Buzzardroost Rock Trail

This trail is 1.5 miles one way to Buzzardroost Rock. Take Weaver Road east of Ohio Brush Creek Bridge off State Route 125, .9 miles to trailhead parking area on south side of road. Trail proceeds across State Route 125; be alert for traffic when crossing road. Buzzardroost is the most popular hike in Adams County and for good reason. A strenuous hike

of three miles to the "Roost" and back rewards hikers with a spectacular view of the Ohio Brush Creek valley. Spring wildflowers, fall colors, and during winter, the surrounding landscape lays bare all its geological features for everyone to see, including the nearby Tiffin cliffs.

2. Davis Memorial State Nature Preserve

This preserve, located on Davis
Memorial Road, contains two half-mile
loop trails, the Sullivantia and the Agave
Ridge Trail, both of which connect to the
Buckeye Trail. Good year-round hiking.
The trails vary from easy to moderate.
Hikers will see a display of spring
wildflowers, unique geological formations
and great fall colors.

3. Lynx Prairie Trail

This is a 1.5-mile loop trail. At Lynx, turn south on Tulip Road, go .3 miles to East Liberty Church and proceed to cemetery. Park on side of cemetery lane and



proceed to southeast corner of cemetery for trailhead. The Lynx Prairie is a national landmark best viewed in late summer when the prairie is blooming. It's an easy hike that features more than 200 species of plants and prairie flowers.

4. Wilderness Trail

This is a 2.5-mile loop trail. At Lynx, take

Lynx Road to Shivener Road, turn north and proceed to parking area and trailhead at end of road. A moderate hike through the Edge of Appalachia Preserve will reveal an unbroken forest with limestone cliffs, white cedar and more than 50 rare plants and flowers. Great spring wildflowers and fall foliage are just some of the sights hikers will observe on their way though the "Wilderness"

5. Shoemaker Preserve Trail

This 1 1/2-mile trail concludes with a loop. Hikers visiting Shoemaker will observe geological formations, dolomite cliffs, a variety of spring wildflowers and a large natural arch. One of Adams County's most scenic trails, it follows Cedar Fork, a tributary of Scioto Brush Creek, and is considered a moderate hike. Take Portsmouth Road east off State Route 32, turn on Pine Gap Road, trailhead is on right.

Please keep in mind that all trails are located in semi-wilderness areas and hikers will likely encounter sinkholes, cliffs, drop



or more than 10 years the Wheat Ridge Amish School Benefit Auction and Supper has served to raise money for the four parochial schools now serving the Wheat Ridge Amish Community in Adams County. The Amish schools are also supported by local fundraising events held throughout the year on Wheat Ridge.
